Alphonso was a most gentle spirit. Full of love & infectious enthusiasm, he was not only generous with his family & friends, but everyone that came into his world. A much-loved son, brother, husband & father, he also leaves behind many who called him a friend & supporter.

One of seven brothers & sisters, Alphonso was born in 1947 in Guangzhou, China. With the family moving to Hong Kong when he was three, he and his brothers attended Wah Yan College through to high school graduation; Alphonso, quiet but well-liked amongst his peers, enjoyed extracurricular clubs like bridge & tennis.

Childhood classmates growing into young men, many in his alum class still value their bonds of friendship with him today.

Like a long line of Hui-generations before him, Alphonso pursued the medical profession, becoming a family physician by immigrating to Canada to earn his university degree in 1966. After schooling in Montréal & Toronto, interning in Vancouver, and early practice in Powassan, Ontario, he ultimately graduated from the University of Toronto Medical School with his CCFP certification (Canadian College of Family Physicians).



It was during this time that he met & married his wife of close to 42 years, Josephine. Blessed with a daughter, Monique, & son, Creighton, they raised

their family in Vancouver, in the same home for the last 37 years, with regular trips to their time-share in Whistler. The 1977 move to the West Coast allowed him to start his clinic in South Granville moving to Oakridge in the early nineties. He was a trusted family doctor to countless patients; seeing some grow to four generations.

Alphonso enjoyed many talents: choral singing, ballroom dancing, fishing, skiing, windsurfing, playing ping-pong & tennis. A tireless volunteer & fundraiser for many community organizations, he spearheaded the "New Life Stem Cell Society" which educated the public on stem cell matching in battling blood disorders & aimed to increase registration amongst ethnic minorities, redressing cultural reluctance to donate, specifically in Chinese-Canadians.

Alphonso's unconditional strength & empathy will be greatly missed by his family, friends, & patients. He always had a warm smile for you. Even though he has gone back into the arms of our Father, to whom he was devoted, he will forever remain in our hearts.
